PE Kits

Homework

<u>Reading Books</u> – The children will be given two books to read at home during the week. They are expected to bring their book bags to school **every day** so they can be heard in school throughout the week. Please encourage your child to read a variety of genres at home as well as their school reading books as this will enhance their development.

<u>Library Books</u> – These books are best kept in the book bags as they can then be changed throughout the week.

<u>Maths</u> – This will be given on a weekly basis on a Tuesday and collected in the following Monday.

<u>English</u> - This will be given on a weekly basis on a Friday and collected in the following Thursday.

<u>Spellings</u> – every half term we will assess the children and will send a list of high frequency words home that the children are expected to read and spell by the end of Key Stage One. In school we will continuously work on these spellings using various approaches such as games, songs, sentence writing and ICT activities. Please work with your child to practise these words in a range of ways as we do in school. This will make it more enjoyable and fun for the children and will hopefully enable them to retain these words.
