



What Does a Doctor Do?

What roles and responsibilities do doctors have?

Doctors treat and care for their patients. Some doctors work in a local doctors' surgery as a GP - this is who you visit when you are not very well. Some are hospital doctors - this is who you see when it is an emergency, like when you have broken your leg. Doctors have to listen to poorly people, look at them, check them and treat them. To treat them, the doctor might give out medicine, tell them how they can get better or send them to another doctor to help. Doctors have to carry on learning new things, go to meetings and training, record things, work with and help other people and be good on the computer.

Where can doctors work?

They can work in doctors' surgeries, hospitals, clinics, army, navy or air force bases, in prisons and more, in our country and abroad.

What do doctors wear and need?

Doctors wear different smart, casual clothes so that they are comfortable and can move easily. Some wear smart clothes and a lot of doctors in hospitals and clinics wear white coats or scrubs. Doctors need stethoscopes, thermometers, medicine, notepads, pens, pencils, clipboards and lots of other medical kit.

What Does a Nurse Do?

What roles and responsibilities do nurses have?

Like doctors, nurses also treat and care for their patients. They help lots of people from those with cuts and other small injuries, to some who are very poorly for a long, long time. They help people get better and become healthy by using plans, doing tests and giving medicine. Nurses in hospitals also deal with emergencies. Nurses are very busy and do lots of things like give jabs, change bandages, check on the patients, clean cuts, help doctors and write notes.

Where can nurses work?

They can work in surgeries, hospitals, clinics, navy, army and air force bases, prisons, homes, schools and other places, in our country and abroad.



What do nurses wear and need?

Nurses usually wear a uniform. This could be scrubs, a white dress or a blue coat and dark trousers. Nurses need needles, gloves, bandages, swabs, tweezers, scissors, notepads, pens, pencils, clipboards, thermometers, medicine and lots of other medical kit.

ALTERNATIVE METHOD

You can also subtract using a number square.

- · Move one square up the column to subtract 10.
- Move one square left to subtract 1.

$$57 - 32 = 25$$
 $30 2$

$$57 - 30 = 27$$
 $27 - 2 = 25$



Remember to partition the second number first.
