





1 and 9, let's draw a line, Draw a heart and draw a sign. 1, 9, 1, 9


8 and 2, now buckle your shoe, Tie your hair and dye it blue. 8, 2, 8, 2,

Now we've learnt all the pairs to ten. That was fun, let's start again! (clap, clap, clap, clap)



I bought 30 socks. How many socks will each child get? Write the calculation you have used.



$$30 \div 10 = 3$$

Pencils come in packs of 10. How many pencils will Talia have? Write the calculation you have used.

Circle the answer you think is correct. Explain your reason for this answer.

A number multiplied by 5 will end In 5 or 0.

I know it cannot be 190 because that is the answer to 19×10 . It can't be 910 because that number is far too large.



Circle the answer you think is correct. Explain your reason for this answer.

A number multiplied by 2 will end in an even number, 94 is the only even number.



500 ÷ 10 = 105 (/ 50 /) 550 / 55

Circle the answer you think is correct. Explain your reason for this answer.

A multiple of ten divided by ten will end in 0. It can't be 550 because it is far too large. I also know that 50 divided by 10 is 5 so 500 divided by 10 will be 50.



160 ÷ 2 = 80 /) 85 / 162 / 89

Circle the answer you think is correct. Explain your reason for this answer.

An even number divided by 2 will have an answer which is even. I know it can't be 162 because that number is too large.




