OPTIONAL CHALLENGE

- Counting forward in tens means you add 10 each time.
- Counting backwards in tens means you take 10 each time.
- TASK I: Using your number square start on 0. Then add 10 each time. What do you notice? When you get to 90 what would be next? Now count backwards in 10s from 90. What do you notice? Discuss with adult.
- TASK 2: Now give your number square to someone. Write out your 10s (forwards and backwards) into your book.
- TASK 3: See next slides for questions. Write the answers in your book.
