
Sing the days of the week song to find out. What day was it yesterday? What day will it be tomorrow? Can you say it in a sentence... Today it is...

SIMON BARTRAM MAAN RE MOOON (a day in the life of Bob)

Our focus skill today is representing our ideas through mark making.

Children giving meaning to the marks they make are their first writing skills.

Think about what Bob might see in space, for example, stars, aliens, planets. Create a spoken description of Bob's rocket journey to the moon. What would he see out of the window of his rocket ship?

Say the sentence: 'Bob went to the moon and saw...' Draw a picture to represent what bob saw on his way to the moon.



Can you tell your adult about your drawing?


Maths Our focus todau

Our focus today is on **repeating patterns**.

Maths Meeting

- Maths maths meeting, 1,2,3,4,5 maths maths meeting, 6,7,8,9,10!
- 10 claps
- 20 taps
- Look at a number line, point to numbers asked e.g. where is 7? Where is 4?

Patterns can be found everywhere around us. Have a look around your house for some patterns. Did you find any wallpaper with patterns on? Did you find any patterns on curtains or on your duvet cover?



Look at the patterns above. Can you talk about the patterns- look at the colours and the shapes.

What would come next in the square and circle pattern?

These patterns are repeating patterns.

Can you make some repeating patterns using 2 or 3 different objects/sizes or colours? You can use any kind of objects!

Ask your grown up to take a picture of your patterns and post them on Facebook or Tapestry.



Phonics

Our focus skills today are listening skills – voice sounds.

Teach a grown-up the song Old MacDonald had a Farm. What animals will be in your song? What noises do the animals make?

Challenge Can your grown up sound talk some of the animals to see if you can blend the sounds to say the word? E.g. 'p-i-g' 'C-OW' 'b-u-ll' 'd-u-ck'

Creative

.Foil printing moons

You will need some paint, a circle cut out of paper or card and some foil. Scrunch up your foil so you can fit it into your hand, then dab it into the paint and print it on to a paper circle. Repeat until you have covered your circle! You will have created a textured cratered moon effect! You could use different colours and make some of the other planets moons!

Daily Activities

- Sharing a story
- Counting how many plates do we need for dinner? How many buttons on your shirt? Counting up the stairs and back down.
- Name recognition and recognising print in the environment post, labels, words on crisp packets, words on clothes.
- Nursery rhymes we use these in class when we transition from one activity to another as it helps us to stay calm and focused.
- Talk about how you are feeling and recognising emotions by looking at each others faces and body language.
- Phonic sound talk break the words into sounds e.g. 'Can you clean your t-ee-th?' 'Put on your h-a-t.'
