- The tense a sentence is written in tells use when the actions or events took place for example in the past, present, future or still continuing.

Year 2 and 3 English

Past Progressive Tense: This is used to describe something that was 'in progress' or happening for a certain amount of time in the past. It is formed with the past tense of 'to be' (was or were) and a verb with an -ing ending.

e.g. I was playing in the garden. We were eating ice cream.

Past tense of 'to be'	Add a verb ending in -ing
I was	fishing
You were	swimming
He/she/it was	sleeping
We were	crying
You were	choosing
They were	jumping

Year 2 and 3 English

Present Progressive Tense: This is used to describe something that is currently happening or taking place now. It is formed with the present tense of 'to be' (am, are, is) and a verb with an -ing ending.

e.g. I am swinging on the swing. They are playing football.

Present tense of 'to be'	Add a verb ending in -ing
I am	fishing
You are	swimming
He/she/it is	sleeping
We are	crying
You are	choosing
They are	jumping


