
Sing the days of the week song to find out. What day was it yesterday? What day will it be tomorrow? Can you say it in a sentence... Today it is...

Literacy

Our focus skill today is retelling the story.

Through play and interaction retell the story, talking about the features of the beginning, middle and end. The use of props will help your child to think about the different stages of the story and encourage the use of the repeated phrases within it..

Use some small world farm animals and bricks to build the farm where Duck did all the work. Use some cuddly toys to play the roles of the animals we meet in the story: Duck, cow, sheep, chickens and the farmer.

Maybe you live on a farm or have pictures of a farm. Use these to inspire your retelling of the parts of the story.

When sharing out an amount it is great if your child first counts how many they have and then share them out. A first introduction is to share something between the two of you...One for me, one for you etc. With two dishes share out some food. It could be anything; fruit, pasta, crisps, sweets.

Count out how many you have then place one in each dish until they have been shared out.

How many do they have each?



Can you share the animals out equally into the two different pens?

(You can do this with lolly sticks and toy or paper animals)

Find opportunities at home to practice the skill of sharing out an amount.

Phonics

Our focus skill today is **alliteration**.



Initial sounds - 'cross the river'

You will need to gather a selection of items such as book, car, hat, juice, apple, doll, puzzle and have a blanket or something to put on the floor to be a river!
Your child can look at the selection of objects and you say...
'cross the river to give me something that starts with the sound 'a,a,a'

See if they can identify the item – 'apple' and bring it over the river for you.

Repeat for other items. If children cannot hear the initial sound support them by accentuating the sound as you name the objects 'b,b,book', 'c,c,car'.

On some paper, card or outside with chalk draw some zigzag and wiggly lines for your child.

Use some small world animals (or bricks) carefully line them up following the lines, be careful not to knock the previous ones down to create an animal parade!


Pouring Station

Can you use a spoon to move some small beans from one dish to another? You could use dried beans, beads, rice, coins,

earrings.



Daily Activities

- Sharing a story
- Counting how many plates do we need for dinner? How many buttons on your shirt? Counting up the stairs and back down.
- Name recognition and recognising print in the environment post, labels, words on crisp packets, words on clothes.
- Nursery rhymes we use these in class when we transition from one activity to another as it helps us to stay calm and focused.
- Talk about how you are feeling and recognising emotions by looking at each others faces and body language.
- Phonic sound talk break the words into sounds e.g. 'Can you clean your t-ee-th?' 'Put on your h-a-t.'
