

Pupil Premium at Bournebrook

At Bournebrook, a small percentage of our children are eligible for Pupil Premium funding. This means we can very carefully target spending, for best impact. Having a small number of children eligible also means that all staff are able to "keep these children in mind" in all we do on a daily basis.

Our allocation in 2019 / 2020 was £12860.00
