



Pupil Premium at Bournebrook

At Bournebrook, a small percentage of our children are eligible for Pupil Premium funding. This means we can very carefully target spending, for best impact. Having a small number of children eligible also means that all staff are able to “keep these children in mind” in all we do on a daily basis.

Our allocation in 2020 / 2021 was £14,105

The impact of our spending and specific costings can be seen in the following table:
